

RESEARCH TEAM PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

2016 Self, Motivation & Virtue Project Conference

CONTENT

Total presentation time per two-member team will be 60 minutes – 40 minutes for the presentation itself and 20 minutes for discussion.

In your presentation, please cover the following categories:

- **Project Overview**
Provide a brief overview of the project, including the hypotheses being tested and the measures being used.
- **Deep Integration**
Discuss how well your team is working together. We wish to create an open and supportive atmosphere, so please be open about any specific challenges you have faced and how you have dealt (or are dealing) with them.
- **Progress**
Describe your objectives and timeline. Discuss how well your team is achieving its objectives, and what you predict accomplishing before the end of the grant period.
- **Obstacles**
Discuss any obstacles you have encountered in your project and your strategies for overcoming them.
- **Deliverables**
Explicitly describe the deliverables to which you committed in your project proposal and discuss your progress toward completing those deliverables. When do you anticipate their completion?

We encourage the use of PowerPoint slides. The conference room will be equipped with full audio/video capabilities. If you plan to use slides, we also encourage you to email them by **May 1st** to Max Parish at smvproject@ou.edu.

Teams are free to select one research team member as the presenter, or to divide the presentation between the two members. We do ask, however, that both team members be prepared to participate in the discussion portion.
